Welcome to a new year and all the prospective new turning projects! Our next meeting will be Tuesday, January 2, 2018. Our demonstrator will be **Rick Orr**. Here is a write-up of his plans.

Threaded Elk Antler and Corian Box:

Rick will turn a threaded box utilizing elk antler for the main body, with Corian pieces for the base and a threaded lid. The threads will be made utilizing a “threading jig” and will NOT be hand chased. Rick will walk through the use of the threading jig for both male and female threads. The female threads will be made in the elk antler and the male threads in the Corian lid.

While the demo is geared towards the use of a mechanical threading jig, it will also implore the use of basic jam chucks plus threaded jam chucks.

A quick review will be made of elk antler as a turning media, the choice of antler pieces, where to get the antler, and its relative price. Rick will also cover the use of Corian as a turning media, its preparation, glue up, and acquisition. Finish techniques are simply sanding up to 12,000 grit using Micro-Mesh products for all the pieces, with no other finish applied.

The demo is geared towards the beginner to intermediate turning audience, but will provide some useful information to all.

A special thank-you to Bear and Alisa Limvere for organizing the Christmas party dinner and preparing the main food dishes. And thanks to each of you who brought salads and desserts. Everything was scrumptious!

Turning Challenge

The turning challenge for January 2018 is anything made from a cast blank.

Although we don't have a category for Raffle Wood Challenge anymore, we still want to see what you make with raffle wood so feel free to write *Raffle wood* in the Additional Information box on the Show-and-Tell form.

The rules for our monthly turning challenge are:

- Self-assess your level of turning (Beginner, Intermediate or Advanced). Do not judge your skill level by how long you have been turning.
- Fill out a Show-and-Tell form with your name, title of the piece, finish used, etc. All of the forms on our website are now interactive and can be filled out online and printed ahead of time. If you want, you can print a blank form and fill it out by hand, and we will also have blank forms at the meeting.
- The Show-and-Tell forms have a check box for "Turning Challenge" and "Show-and-Tell only". Check the appropriate box.
- To enter the turning challenge, there are 3 folders marked Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. Each folder has numbered slips of paper that are color coded to the skill level:

Beginner = Red
Intermediate = Blue
Advanced = Yellow

- Pick a bag of numbers from your respective skill folder - it doesn't matter which number you pick. The Beginner folder only has red numbers, Intermediate only has blue numbers, etc.
- Write the number on your card in case things get mixed up, and place the bag with your numbers on top of your Show-and-Tell card (so people can vote for you). Do not throw the bag away!
- You cannot vote for yourself.

December Gallery

No gallery this month since we didn't have a regular meeting. Instead here are the guidelines for preparing a "Beads of Courage" bowl if you are interested in doing that in this new year.

Woodworker Guidelines

Beads of Courage has had an increase in interest from generous wood artists kind enough to donate their lidded bowls and boxes to our Beads of Courage members. With our Beads of Courage program growing exponentially, there is an even greater need for wooden boxes. Children and young adults are finding strength in a whole new way by receiving handcrafted, beautiful boxes. The gift of having a safe place to keep hard-earned Beads of Courage can bring a sense of comfort to the heart and is a beautiful way to honor the strength and courage of children battling serious illness.

Bead Bowls/Boxes Guidelines:

- Beads of Courage members may receive thousands of beads. It is desirable for your boxes to hold them all. As a result, turned or rectangular lidded boxes need to be large. Larger is better! Recommended interior dimensions for turned boxes are: 6" diameter (5" minimum), 5" height (4" minimum). Recommended interior dimensions for flatwork boxes are: 4" x 6" x 4".
- Box bases should be wide enough so the box is stable and does not tip over easily. Lids for Beads of Courage boxes should be easy for small or ill children to remove or lift. Any finials should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate so they don't break. Avoid excessively elaborate designs that may easily break or be damaged; remember, hospital rooms have limited storage space.
- Finishing of boxes is extremely important! Beads of Courage members who receive these boxes are susceptible to germs/infections/mold. Bowls that have not been properly sealed can harbor mold. Please take the time to ensure you are using a safe finishing process that does not contain toxic materials. Also do not use finishes like linseed oil that take a long time to outgas.
- All kinds of wood are beautiful! Please refrain from painting Beads of Courage boxes. Instead, highlight the beauty of the wood with clear varnish, a stain, and/or burning.
- If possible, please purchase the Woodturner Donation Incentive Package. The package includes personalized Woodworker Artist cards and individual Beads of Courage® ceramic logo beads. Many woodworkers like to use the Beads of Courage® ceramic logo bead in their design (20 beads for \$25 with free shipping). If this is not possible, you can find a way to engrave, burn or letter "Beads of Courage" onto the lid or side of the box. Designed specifically for your donation, each logo bead purchased comes with a Woodworker Artist card that includes your personal signature. Ceramic logo beads can be purchased at www.beadsofcourage.org ⇌ Artists ⇌ Information for Woodturners.
- It is nice if you can personalize your donation. Marking your name or initials, type(s) of wood, and date on the box bottom is one way. It is also nice to include a personal note of encouragement, business card, etc. inside the box.
