## News

Our February demonstrator is Professional Woodturner, Demonstrator and Instructor **Glenn Lucas** from Ireland. Glenn will demo a *Dublin Viking Thin Wall Bowl*.

Here's a description of the demo:

This simple elegant bowl is based on one made in the eleventh century by the Vikings which was recently discovered under the streets of Dublin in Ireland. The intricate closed form of this piece can help to perfect the techniques which are useful in all aspect of turning. We will take a look at selecting the right tools for the job and then mastering the cuts. From quickly rough shaping a piece to achieving a smooth surface and fluid curves straight from the bowl gouge. The closed form adds quite a challenge to getting around the bottom of the bowl with the gouge especially with the thinner wall. I can show you how to modify a gouge to make the final pass at the bottom leaving very little sanding. Negative Rake scrapers will also be discussed and their benefits.

Glenn has his own Signature Line of tools that are available through Craft Supplies, and he has produced 5 DVD's (the club library has them all). More information can be found at: <http://glennlucaswoodturning.com/>

### A Special Announcement from Pat Scott Concerning our May Demonstrator:

I know it’s still a few months away, but I wanted to give you a preview of our May demonstrator **Jason Clark**. Jason is from Chicago, and was a demonstrator at the AAW Symposium in Kansas City this past year where we met him. For those that are not familiar with Jason Clark or his work, you can visit his website at [www.jtcturning.com](http://www.jtcturning.com).

Jason will demo an *Interactive Saturn Bowl* for us, and then teach a class the next day so you can learn to make your own! There are still a few openings left for Jason’s class, don’t wait too long or you’ll miss a fantastic opportunity. The cost is \$125 per person. This is not your ordinary bowl, see the pictures below and be prepared to be amazed.

Jason will make the rounds while he’s in Colorado:

- May 1 - Evening demo at Front Range Woodturners – Saturn Bowl
- May 2 - All day hands-on class for FRW – the all day class consists of two “projects”:
  - 1). Several multi axis spindles followed by a multi-axis lidded box with a twist.
  - 2). Ultra thin parting tool which will then be used to create a Saturn bowl.
- May 3 - Evening demo at Rocky Mountain Woodturners, Loveland  
*Unconventional Hollowing – Turning the Torus*  
*The demonstration will focus on the turning of a torus shaped hollow form including an unconventional approach to hollowing as well as methods for reverse chucking including a unique double walled vacuum drum.*
- May 4 - Evening demo at Pikes Peak Woodturners, Colorado Springs  
*Lidded box with a twist. Attendees will see a short presentation of some of Jason’s work as well as a preview of the evening’s project. He will demonstrate his process for turning a multi-axis lidded box with 3 sides that twist 120 degrees along the length of the box.*

*Interactive Saturn bowl. Attendees will see a short presentation of some of Jason’s work as well as a preview of the evening’s projects. He will demonstrate his process for turning a small bowl with a wide flat brim that rotates around the rim of the bowl. A jig will then be made to aid in one or more offset rings to be cut free so that they can rotate around the bowl.*

**The turning challenge for February 2018 is to make any kind of box.**

Although we don't have a category for Raffle Wood Challenge anymore, we still want to see what you make with raffle wood so feel free to write *Raffle wood* in the Additional Information box on the Show-and-Tell form.

The rules for our monthly turning challenge are:

- Self-assess your level of turning (Beginner, Intermediate or Advanced). Do not judge your skill level by how long you have been turning.
- Fill out a Show-and-Tell form with your name, title of the piece, finish used, etc. All of the forms on our website are now interactive and can be filled out online and printed ahead of time. If you want, you can print a blank form and fill it out by hand, and we will also have blank forms at the meeting.
- The Show-and-Tell forms have a check box for "Turning Challenge" and "Show-and-Tell only". Check the appropriate box.
- To enter the turning challenge, there are 3 folders marked Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. Each folder has numbered slips of paper that are color coded to the skill level:

Beginner = Red  
Intermediate = Blue  
Advanced = Yellow

- Pick a bag of numbers from your respective skill folder - it doesn't matter which number you pick. The Beginner folder only has red numbers, Intermediate only has blue numbers, etc.
- Write the number on your card in case things get mixed up, and place the bag with your numbers on top of your Show-and-Tell card (so people can vote for you). Do not throw the bag away!
- You cannot vote for yourself.

“Welcome” to everyone who joined Front Range Woodturners during the past year and “Howdy” to all those who renewed their membership. Less than 50% of our members chose to utilize their club library last year. Some clubs elect to charge for each library item borrowed. FRW does not and has no plans to charge for using our library resources that is currently comprised of 1,400 magazines, books, and videos. Whether you are new to turning, looking to brush up on your skills, learn a new technique or seek ideas for an advanced level project you owe it to yourself to check out your library. ### **Ladies of the Lathe Workshop – Rude Osolnik Candlesticks with Henry Williams**

9:00am - 3:00pm Saturday, February 17 at Rocklers

Rude Osolnik is considered the Dean of American Woodturners and in his lifetime made more than 140,000 of his Arts and Crafts style candlesticks. We'll each be making a set of 3 similar candlesticks in this workshop utilizing some basic spindle turning skills including:

- roughing, peeling, and facing cuts,
- long sweeping coves with a spindle gouge
- drilling holes on the lathe
- lathe mountings between centers, 4 jaw chuck, and jam chuck
