September Demonstration

Our September demonstrator will be Larry Fox. Larry will show us how he makes threaded inserts for urns.

A fellow woodturner, **Milo Scott** of Monument, makes wooden threaded inserts in four different sizes out of hard maple. I will demonstrate how to apply these inserts to a lidded box or urn resulting in a screw-on lid that will align the grain pattern of the lid and body perfectly. As with almost all woodturning projects, mistakes can occur at any step of the process. I will purposefully make the mistakes at each step and show how they can be fixed along the way and still end up with a perfectly aligned grain pattern of lid to base.

Turning Challenge

The rules for our monthly turning challenge are:

- Self-assess your level of turning (Beginner, Intermediate or Advanced). Do not judge your skill level by how long you have been turning.
- Fill out a Show-and-Tell form with your name, title of the piece, finish used, etc. All of the forms on our website are now interactive and can be filled out online and printed ahead of time. If you want, you can print a blank form and fill it out by hand, and we will also have blank forms at the meeting.
- The Show-and-Tell forms have a check box for "Turning Challenge" and "Show-and-Tell only". Check the appropriate box.
- To enter the turning challenge, there are 3 folders marked Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. Each folder has numbered slips of paper that are color coded to the skill level:

Beginner = Red Intermediate = Blue Advanced = Yellow

- Pick a bag of numbers from your respective skill folder it doesn't matter which number you pick. The Beginner folder only has red numbers, Intermediate only has blue numbers, etc.
- Write the number on your card in case things get mixed up, and place the bag with your numbers on top of your Show-and-Tell card (so people can vote for you). Do not throw the bag away!
- You cannot vote for yourself.

>Group Purchases and Individual Catalog Orders – Roger Holmes

If you ordered a Front Range Woodturner polo shirt or t-shirt and did not pick it up at the August meeting, it may be picked up from Roger at the September meeting.

INDUSTRIAL ABRASIVES: Industrial Abrasives (IA) is our principal sanding supplies vendor, but individual orders to Klingspor may also be member-processed (see details on the FRW website). Prices for Hook & Loop (H&L) mandrels, and H&L Discs remain the lowest in the marketplace, with the weight of the backing heavier than the competition.

Items on IA's Wholesale Price List but not on the FRW order sheet may be addressed on a case by case basis. Because S&H charges from Pennsylvania for oversized items are so expensive, ordering 1 yd x 1yd sheets of H&L, for example, is cost effective only if at least nine (9) sheets are ordered, resulting in a sheet cost of about \$17.25. With a pair of scissors and a little effort, 250 + 2.25" x 2.25" squares may be cut from each sheet, making the effective cost per disc about 7 cents. The squares may be affixed to a 2" mandrel, the corners clipped off, and the sides crimped around the mandrel - making sanding the inside of bowls much more efficient, and also making the mandrels last longer. The same process may be used for the 3" mandrels, using 3.25" squares.

Supplies of smaller sheets in 25 packs $(3.15" \times 4.5")$ – of the same H&L Aluminum Oxide, Stearate-coated material used in the discs, for **\$2.50** + **S&H**, continue to be available.

STARBOND. Starbond is our principal cyanocrylate (CA) glue vendor. Prices increased as of January 2019 (see new order sheets). Our minimum order is \$100, but if we order at a 200+ level, a 15% AAW-related discount kicks in, making S&H essentially free.

They decided that these partially completed items should be distributed, completed and returned to the U.K. for an exhibit and auction. This book documents 118 pieces on 128 pages, through excellent photography of the text. Several turners well known to our club were involved with this effort. These Colorado residents: **Cindy Drozda, Keith Gotschall, and Tom Wirsing,** have each demonstrated for our club on multiple occasions. 


