In September, the guy called Scott and said he was ready to cut down the tree. When Scott saw the tree, he realized he could only use about 10% of it. He let the club know about the tree and it was decided that we would take it all. We made an announcement at the October club meeting and through email. On November 7th, fourteen people showed up to help salvage the tree. Robin Luther brought his chain saw mill to make some slabs. His expertise helped make the harvest of the beautiful red oak tree a success. And a great time was had by all.

WOOD SALE

Alex Bradley - fineturnedwood@gmail.com

Even with short notice, Alex Bradley's wood sale on Saturday, November 18th was well attended by both clubs. For those of you that missed the notice, Alex moved 9,000 lbs of her dad's wood stash from Maryland to Colorado in October (Phil F. Brown, https://fineturnedwood.com/about-phil/). Phil grew up in Denver (54th and Osceola) before moving to Maryland and becoming a professional woodturner. The wood had been stored indoors by Phil for 20+ years before getting loaded on a truck and driven to CSWoods vacuum kiln for a heat treat. Alex is selling the wood to help fund moving and storing his rough-turned pieces that she is planning on turning into her old age.

Over 26 club members came to check out what was on offer. With 140 bowl blanks/pieces of wood sold, Alex's goal to move out of the smaller storage unit was achieved. There are currently 234 bowl blanks/pieces of wood still available with many of them

being burls, walnut and cherry. Alex is still working on pricing the larger burls and boards and will make those available as soon as they are ready (the Koa has been unearthed and confirmed but how do you price Koa?). Once we have warmer temperatures in the forecast, another "open house" sale date will be announced. In the meantime, please contact Alex directly to set up a private shopping time (best between 9-2:30pm during the week or before 4pm on the weekend). Industrial Abrasives - send orders to Jay Miller Industrial Abrasives is our principal vendor for sanding supplies. Prices for hook & loop mandrels and discs remain the lowest in the marketplace and their backing is a heavier weight than the competition.

Starbond - send orders to Jay Miller

Starbond is our CA glue supplier. Our minimum order is \$100, but we receive an additional discount at \$200, making shipping free. Sign up for Starbond's newsletter to be notified of sales that beat our wholesale prices.

Craft Supplies - send orders to Ted Mellin Craft Supplies sells a very wide range of products. Our minimum group purchase is \$1000. Members may not place individual orders to get a discount.

Spence Industrial Supply - send orders to Ted Mellin We will be purchasing band saw blades from Spence once a year, in April, unless a member can meet the minimum order in another quarter. All blades are carbon steel flexback in 1/4" (4 tpi), 3/8"(3 tpi), or 1/2" (4 tpi) width, hook tooth, and .025"thick. Our minimum buy is 20 blades for each width in any length.

A month ago a lady contacted the club to find someone to turn a replacement baluster for her home near Washington Park. **Bill Jackson** thought he could do that! Keith Motzner gave him some guidance on using a 3-wheel spindle rest to dampen vibration and flexing of the wood. Finishing the baluster to match 125 years of age was another challenge. Golden Oak Watco Oil was a close match to the base color, but how to get some "dirt" in the crevices





and grain so the new would match the old? He used some dark brown paste wax to add some "used" look to the grain. And Bill is happy to report that the homeowner was very pleased with the result.




Al Murphy made this orb on a stand of spalted maple, bird's eye maple and hard maple.

It was a light month for **Joe Clark**, but he got a few things done for Christmas presents. He made a couple of Steampump pens (Yep, you read that right. Steampump for the pump handle

to expose and retract the pen tip.) One in flame spalted box elder (L) the other in a wood/acrylic mix Fiji blank. He also made a crochet setthe handle in Fiji again with six interchangeable hooks.







This is **Gordon Dalby's** attempt to make a very thinly (approx 1/8" thick) turned maple burl to match one he received from Robin Costelle. It measures 1-1/2" high by 7" diameter.

Debra Higley-Feldman turned a 4x6" aspen box with a Schacht maple/cherry lid. The finish is shellac/Danish wood oil/carnauba. She didn't realize until she was finished that the finial top looks a bit like a poop emoji. That fits considering all the fungus and worm poop in the woods.





Melissa Hunter has been working on some snow loaded bent trees; these two are Haun wood from Australia. The first is 8" tall and the second is 6-1/2". She also made a segmented bowl of purple heart and ash that measures 6" wide and 3" deep.





Last year, **Pat Scott** made 55 Christmas trees for a craft fair and sold them all. So this year he made over 130 trees!



Brenda Blaesing took a scroll saw class and learned how to make inside cuts as well as outside cuts with this butterfly as the class project. She thought it would make a nice ornament so finger painted with alcohol ink on translucent paper (a technique she learned from Cathie McLean) for the monarch background.

Blaine Blaesing made this 11" bowl from a

beautiful piece of box elder (we think) he bought at Alex Bradley's wood sale a few weeks ago. The hemp oil finish darkened the colors and increased the richness. He also made a pedestal box with a finial lid out of aspen and Schacht maple, dyed black. The piece is 15" tall.
