# MAY DEMONSTRATOR -Doug Schneiter Tuesday, May 6th-In Person and via Zoom

Doug Schneiter has been passionate about woodturning for over five decades, ever since first stepping up to a lathe in high school woodshop. With a name that literally translates to "a woodsman who cuts," it's no surprise that Doug



has always felt a deep connection to the forest and working with wood. That passion led him to pursue degrees in Industrial Arts and Sciences at the University of Northern Iowa and Colorado State University, eventually launching a nearly 30-year career in education before retiring in 2014.

Doug's woodturning journey was reignited in the early 1990s after attending an AAW symposium in Fort Collins, Colorado. Inspired by the evolution of the craft and the vibrant turning community, he helped form a local woodturning club and found mentorship that shaped his growth as both a maker and instructor. Since then, Doug has become a sought-after demonstrator, teaching at Woodcraft and traveling across the western U.S. to share his knowledge at club demos, hands-on workshops, and national symposiums—having demonstrated in eight western states and at four major symposiums to date.

His work-deeply influenced by the ancient and contemporary Pueblo cultures of New Mexico-has been featured in both American Woodturner and the U.K.'s Woodturning magazine,

Pat Scott gave a great class in April on turning plates. It included sizes and types of plates and bases, choosing the best wood (quarter sawn, grain orientation, figuring), turing an inlaid tenon on the top of the plate, then flipping it onto a 4" 4-jaw chuck and turning and sanding the underside, followed by turning a wooden 4-jaw jig for the chuck to turn and finish the top of the plate.









The May class will be held on Tuesday, May 20th from 9:30 to 4:00. **Don Prorak** will be showing how to make tool handles with removable inserts.

**Craft Supplies** - send orders to Ted Mellin Craft Supplies sells a very wide range of products. Our minimum group purchase is \$1000. Members may not place individual orders to get a discount.

**Spence Industrial Supply -** send orders to Ted Mellin We will be purchasing band saw blades from Spence once a year, in April, unless a member can meet the minimum order in another quarter. All blades are carbon steel flexback in 1/4" (4 tpi), 3/8"(3 tpi), or 1/2" (4 tpi) width, hook tooth, and .025"thick. Our minimum buy is 20 blades for each width in any length.

Here are some projects that members have been working on this month.

**Debra Higley** turned a 5x13" hollow form of canary wood and walnut. The body was finished with tung oil and carnauba, and the finial in lacquer.



Al Murphy made this threaded purpleheart and maple burl urn for his dear departed kitty of 23 years.



Curt Vogt completed a curly maple bowl with a wide rim this month. It is approximately 7" by 1 3/4" and has a soft satin finish of rubbed-in wipe-on poly. The photos are looking into the bowl and at the decorated bottom.

**Coy Thorburn** recently turned this pen. It uses walnut as the wood for the barrel and it's a standard 7mm pen. It's finished with shine juice.



This bowl was turned by **Don August** at the wood shop at Covenant Living. His first attempt at segmenting, the piece is 8" tall by 7" diameter of Argentine Orange, teak, canary, walnut and purple heart. **Gordon Dalby** served as Don's mentor for the project.

**Brenda Blaesing** attended the April LOTL boxmaking class but had to leave early and didn't finish her piece. She completed it the next day, her first

turning at home in quite a while. The box is cherry and the lid is walnut and cherry with a vintage button for a bit of bling. It's finished with Odie's Oil. Thanks to **Raleigh Lockhart** for providing the wood and the button!

She also made a few magic wands, inspired by **Dave Hawley's** LOTL class in March.







Now that spring has sprung, garden flowers won't be far behind. In preparation, **Blaine Blaesing** made several vases, varying in height from 9" to 13". They're made from Eastern red cedar, mesquite and ash. All pieces were finished with lacquer.



This month, **Ken Rollins** made three bowls from Wisconsin Birch that he got from a firewood pile. From left to right, they have segmented rims from walnut, redwood, and mahogany. The donors of this wood are visiting in May so he needed to have something for them to choose from.
